

Errata

Please note the following corrections:

- **Page 3:** The sentence “The most recent Australian Bureau of Statistics Personal Safety Survey found that most women assaulted in the last 12 months were assaulted by either a current or previous partner” is amended as follows: “*The most recent Australian Bureau of Statistics Personal Safety Survey found that 31% of women physically assaulted in the last 12 months were assaulted by a current or previous partner.*” ¹⁰

- **Page 3:** The sentence “Data from the Personal Safety Survey also indicates that women reporting violence in intimate relationships are significantly more likely than men to experience repeated acts of violence” is amended as follows: “*Data from the Personal Safety Survey also indicates that of those reporting violence in a current or previous relationship, women were more likely than men to have experienced more than one incident of violence (45.8% versus 25.7% for current and 67.6% versus 60.1% for previous).*”
- **Page 5:** The sentence: “Exposure to domestic and family violence increases children’s risk of mental health, behavioural and learning difficulties in the short term; and, in the case of boys particularly, may lead to them perpetrating violence as adults” is amended as follows: “*Exposure of young people to domestic and family violence may lead to them perpetrating violence as adults*”. ^{25, 26}
