I am concerned at the loss of native trees and vegetation that we have suffered during the bushfire season and the possibility that many more trees will be cut down as the 10/50 clearing code is continued or extended. I see in my suburb that some residents use bushfire risk as an excuse to remove any or every tree within their residential block, when other measures to reduce risk are being ignored. I am devastated at the loss of vegetation that has occurred in Epping over the past decade (particularly the past 3 years) and I profoundly believe that we need to retain mature trees as a contribution to carbon storage and mitigation of climate change.
