Cudmirrah, Berrara and Sussex Inlet are surrounded by national parks, the impact of a bush fire could have been reduced if hazard reduction (HR)was carried out in a timely manner. At Berrara a HR was not conducted for 14 years, the local RFSB asked for this to happen and permission was refused. I believe the responsibility for HR (one Kilometer surrounding the village) should be that of the local RFSB. National Park authorities should not block fire trails and prevent RFS from entering the National Park to fight the fire as happened on Old Berrara Rd
