1.3 Response to bushfires

ToR 5 - are our evacuation refuges ready for large numbers of people for reasonable amounts of time? These resources could be deployed in many locations statewide, and provide significant benefit in non-fire times also. What other items were most needed by evacuees and can they be sensibly stockpiled in refuge locations?

ToR 5 - there was significant goodwill from the community to donate materials and time to help affected people and areas. Many accumulations of goods were prepared and sent by truck to various places, but this seemed to be adhoc and sometimes unhelpful ('stop sending museli bars'). Could there be an official list and coordination of items actually required by a) firefighters b) people evacuated (short term) c) people evacuated (longer term) d) wildlife.

ToR 8, 9 11 - There were unprecedented and traumatic evacuations from various places during the fires. Are we prepared for even larger evacuations and how would they play out? - for example the majority of the blue mountains needing to be evacuated to Sydney (80,000 people)
