I live in a bush fire prone area and during the 1994 catastrophic fires in Ingleside my property was one of the few properties to be unscathed by these fires. The reason for this is simple, the practice of using cold season fuel reduction annually. Although the fires threatened my property I was single handed able to avoid fires taking hold on my land. For three days I fought fires outside my boundaries due to spot fire and ember attack, but not on my land. I was prepared and ready and all the preparation paid off. My land has trees and grass but had low ground fuel. Since that time, for most people it has become illegal to practice cold weather fuel reduction with now heavy fines for doing so. Simply put, farmers and residents of bushy properties understand the simple practice of fuel reduction in winter. Indigenous representatives are also advocating this simple practice.

The knee jerk reaction to ban this practice after the 1994 fires has been a major contributor to impact on rural properties. It is not only the indigenous people that understand this commonsense and simple practice, let the farmers and rural property owners to have a return to these simple but effective practices.
