Nightmare started on my birthday 6th Sept 2019.

Guy Fawkes NP & Bees Nest fires kicked off in dramatic fashion.

My biggest criticism of the ensuring debacle is the 'centralised control' by Incident Management Centres far removed from the good field operators and boots on the ground.

Lack of communications, even mobile phone communications faltered.

Heroic action by the small unit at Tyringham save both it's township and Dundurabin.

Command and Control bounced from Armidale to Glen Innes to Ulmarra. With Forestry seemly ruling the roost. Lots

of their failed strategies responsible for many communities under direct threat and sadly in some cases burnt out entirely eg Nymboida.

Specific example was the burning out of conservation zones and habitat trees in failed attempt to save Cloud's Creek Pine Plantation. Lack of staffing to maintain nightly patrols added to the unfolding catastrophe. Local units need decentralized control to respond to the fires reported insteading if waiting till actual houses are threaten.

In closing Mr David Owen (well done 35 recommendations Lismore flood 2017) we need a paid RFS similar to Army Reserve. Paid for training, when called out and tax and Centrelink exempt. The hard core old school volunteers stay in local area and region.
