1.3 Response to bushfires
In my area we had bushfires in January 2019 and had to evacuate on two occasions. I live in the town of Geeveston

Surely standard rules enforced by the state governments can save homes, towns and public areas from wild fires. The truth is that councils play politics similar to state governments who play green politics with people's assets and health and safety. There should be no way that a town can burn or suburbs burn if councils and governments do their jobs. Fire prevention is not just playing around with backburns off season cold burning. It is keeping the paddocks and streets clear of inflammables and allowing home owners to carry out their own preventions as well. During the Vic fires of 2011 one owner was fined \$40,000 for protecting his own property . His was the only home to survive in his street. (anecdotally.) Politicians and councils playing games is a huge contributor to the bush fire danger. It is time council and other were supervised and told how to prevent their towns from burning. Councils and State governments have duty of safety for citizens and for the assets of citizens. The failure is Local Councils playing politics and not doing their jobs. I would expect you to address this matter urgently. Councils have failure and maybe fire management should be taken off them and they should be supervised in how to carry out proper fire management. No more politics.
