My name is Robert Cutler McMahon. I am a 70yr old farmer of Ellerslie Adelong. Our property address is

We were severely impacted by the Dunn,s Road fire on 4/01/20 including losing our home of 45yrs. Along with many others we are angry/distressed /annoyed by fire management /mismanagement. Better early management could have contained and extinguished this fire.

- 1)There needs to be greater local input to management decisions
- 2) More and better maintained buffer zones between State and Private Forestry and National Parks
- 3) A major change in National Park Management to incorporate regular and frequent cool fire hazard reduction burns
- 4) Do wild fires only burn between 9 -5 and not on public holidays or weekends? Hume Forests, National Parks and RFS seem to think so .After hours shifts were left to exhausted local Brigades and Farmers. Isn,t this the most sensible time to grade and burn containment lines.
- 5) The watch and Act classification involved too much watching and little action. My family witnessed 4 incidents where visiting RFS units would not act.
