On new years eve 2019 I was with my brigade suppressing the Mytle Mountain fire, at that time the Badja forest fire impacted our property (witch we still own) with the loss of our home of 40 years and 4 out buildings (sheds and studio full of equipment, machinery and personal property)and other infrastructure. This property not being our primary place of residence precluded our eligibility for any of the bush fire relief grants. Not being insured means our place is a total loss as this was our investment for our future, and represented 40 years of work. However we are registered for the clean up witch we are

looking forward to.
