<b>Your story</b>	<p>I wish to raise two issues of concern. 1. I live in the Tweed Shire and late last year (2019) we were affected by bushfires in the Border Ranges, Springbrook National Park (Queensland) and Mount Nardi (NSW). regarding the Sugar Can farmers being allowed to burn even on days of Total Fire Ban in this part of NSW (far north coast) ! under a special exemption. We (my local community) had been on Total Fire Ban alert (for the whole of NSW) for days and one early morning a massive plume of smoke erupted adjacent to suburban homes. It created a lot of anxiety and stress you can imagine among the residents. It turned out to be a sugar cane farmer burning off his plantation. Please change this so that it never happens again. In QLD sugar cane burn offs are not allowed during Total Fire Ban days or periods of forecast extreme fire conditions. It is now more common practice in QLD to harvest green sugar cane without burning off. We experience a lot of black ash from the burn offs, and adverse health affects on people with breathing difficulties (asthma etc...). The burn offs also release large volumes of CO2 into the atmosphere. Please legislate so that Sugar Cane is harvested green.
