Your story	For almost a week we had no internet or phone, and as we don't have normal tv just subscription services, we were in a complete blackout of information as to what was going on. We couldn't leave our estate as the roads were flooded. The water was edging closer and closer to our property and the whole time concerned about my

wife and children.

We couldn't get and messages or know if our house was going to go under so barely slept, and was rationing out what food we had as we couldn't access a supermarket.

We literallyhad no time to decide what we. We're doing and the fear hasn't left, we see rain and months later the ground is still soggy and doesn't take much to start building up.

1.1 Causes and contributing factors

Local council has overdeveloped, they have increase building heights in essence causing a damn for the lower lying areas of Ballina. Prior to this the water was dispersed over a greater area. State council had poorly managed the construction of the highway and drains quickly filled with debris further more adding to a dam like effect. Lastly the council hasn't maintained the river and the lack of dredging caused a longer delay for the water to go back out at seas.
