Your story	We moved to our property August 2021. We Are partially on the flood plain of the Coldstream River. When we purchased the property the previous owners explained where the water would come up to and how long we would be curoff from town for, three days.

We were prepared for three days when it got to

four days and no idea how much longer we

began to get concerned for our food supply. We were lucky to have a friend who was able to travel the highway and we were able to walk to the highway from our home to retrieve some groceries they had purchased for us.

Our cattle had all been moved to higher ground and after the five days we had basically no nutritional food for them to eat. We couldn't get supplies of hay or silage as the road out was impassable. Our neighbour shared some of his cattle feed with us.

Since the initial flood we have had two more .
The water didn't come quite as high in the second but all of our lower land and pasture was completely submerged in the second and third flood.

We have been very fortunate to be allocated feed for our stock and animals, on a recurring basis, from the amazing organisation Feed for Friends.

With the continued rain it is making driving on our property impossible, so we walk.

It would have been great if the emergency fodder allocations from the DPI were available for each flood as the water inundation is affecting our pasture availability for our cattle and the pastures regrowth.
