Your story	It rained for over a week. There was storm after storm and we had hail on several occasions. The water rose at an unprecedented level. In the 54 and 74 floods the water went 1 metre at our house, this time it was 3.5 metres and went halfway up the walls in the second storey. We got out by boat. We did not have flood insurance as technically water should never have went into

the second storey of our home. The water sat for nearly 2 weeks as it could not get away. We could not get back to our house so by the time we got back we had lost everything. There was a mixture of mud, septic and diesel through our home. It was like a massive muddy ocean and the new highway attributed to the fact the water did not get away, it acted as a dam wall. Where the highway is, is where flood water would normally flow through. My family and I are now traumatised by the event and will never be able to financially recover.
