Your story

Background:

Since 2003, Arts Northern Rivers has grown to become the peak arts organisation for the region, servicing seven local government areas. We are one of the 15 Regional Arts Boards that make up the regional arts network (RADO's) of New South Wales, providing strategic direction for sustainable arts and cultural development across the regions. As the peak arts organisation for our region we deliver services and projects that foster artistic innovation and excellence and work to ensure access and engagement with arts and cultural activity.

The Northern Rivers has the highest concentration creatives outside of a capital centre. Estimated Annual turnover for the Creative Industries in the Northern Rivers: \$20,000,000.

It is these creatives and artists that have been at the centre of the identity and strength of the Northern Rivers. These artists have been decimated by the floods, lost studios, smashed future income locally, loss of equipment and works in development and life's work. This has monumental flow-on impacts to the towns themselves, losing vibrancy, economic flow-on and unique creative identity.

Arts Northern Rivers itself as an organisation, like many, many others is uninsured for flood. We lost our full office, computers, servers, resources..to the replacement value of around \$45,000.

Artists and creative professionals are also largely uninsured due to prohibitive costs of flood insurance.

 We estimate a total damage of over \$4.5m in lost work, equipment, studios and artworks to the Independent creative sector. Organisations damages NORPA/Lismore Regional Gallery/Byron School of Art etc can be estimated at around \$5,000,000

By area:

54% Lismore, 22% Byron, 12% Tweed, 4% Richmond Valley, 2% Clarence Valley, 1.8% Ballina and 1.8% Kyogle.

By art form/practice:

71% Visual Artists, 24% Musicians, 22% Performers, 15% Digital Artists, 12% Photographers 12%, 10% Designers, 8% Indigenous Artist, 7% Literature and 5% Screen.

1.2 Preparation and planning

After the record breaking 2017 floods in Lismore and the region, organisations like M\Arts, Arts Northern Rivers, The Northern Rivers
Conservatory, Lismore Regional Gallery and cuntlss small to medium creative businesses and organisations created flood plans – which they all enacted in February as the waters rose, moving much of their collections and equipment upstairs or to higher ground.

These measures proved to be insufficient – but were better than local council precautions, which Louis describes as basically non-existent.

1.3 Response to floods

One of the first things Arts Northern Rivers undertook to do was to visit as many studios/artists/organisations as we could access right across the impacted areas of Clarence Valley, Richmond Valley, Lismore, Tweed shire (Murwillumbah), Byron and Kyogle. On behalf of the widespread devastation to the creative sector, we lobbied and advocated to State and

Federal Arts Ministers for awareness and support. We started a fundraising campaign. We have delivered over \$220,000 in direct rapid response grants to individual artists affected by the catastrophic floods in the Northern Rivers. We have undertaken workshops in recovery and planning with small business facilitators and advisors.

1.4 Transition from incident response to recovery

SHORT-MEDIUM TERM RECOVERY:

From our data collection, feedback and sector voice, we have surmised that the 3 most needed actions going forward in the short-to-medium term are:

A sector forum

A temporary (12 month) space for the creative industries to collectively recover Future VISIONing

OVERVIEW:

Arts Northern Rivers is proposing a creative sector-led approach to recovery and community resilience following the 2022 flood disaster in the Northern Rivers.

ORGANISER:

Since 2003, Arts Northern Rivers (ANR) has grown to become the peak arts organisation for the region, servicing six local government areas. We are one of the 15 Regional Arts Development Organisation's (RADO's) from across New South Wales, providing strategic direction for sustainable arts development across the regions. ANR delivers services and projects that foster artistic innovation and excellence and work to ensure access and engagement with arts and cultural activity.

ANR's main objective is to provide practical support for priority areas of the recovery of the creative industries to bolster the sustainable recovery and rebuild agenda of the entire region.



BACKGROUND:

The Northern Rivers has the highest concentration creatives outside of a capital centre. It is these creatives and artists that have been at the centre of the identity and strength of the Northern Rivers. These artists have been decimated by the floods, lost studios, smashed future income locally, loss of equipment and works in development and life's work. This has monumental flow-on impacts to the towns themselves, losing vibrancy, economic flow-on and unique creative identity. **Estimated Annual turnover for the Creative Industries in the Northern Rivers: \$20,000,000.**

Given the past two years of Covid-19 and now the devastating floods, this project addresses impacts of isolation, creative business atrophy and positive regional futures. The Arts and Cultural sector has been decimated and fractured, especially in the Northern Rivers region, with many creatives asking the question where to now? This project aims to bring creatives together, revitalise cohorts and networks of creatives and get us on the path towards a thriving future.

FLOODS MARCH 2022:

ANR LED IMMEDIATE-SHORT RESPONSE:

Arts Northern Rivers, like many other organisations and business was uninsured for flood. We lost our full office, computers, servers, and resources to the replacement value of around \$45,000.

Immediately following the floods, ANR visited studios, artists, and organisations and lobbied State and Federal Arts Ministers for awareness, and funding support. Through this advocacy and our own fundraising campaign, within the first eight weeks of the disaster ANR delivered \$220,000 in direct rapid response grants to 200 individual flood affected creatives, who received a one-off immediate payment of \$1000 towards their recovery. This funding was allocated as follows:

Through this response, ANR gained a sector wide snapshot of the direct impact, financial losses and damage from both independent creatives and organisations across the region:

- We estimate a total damage of over \$4.5m in lost work, equipment, studios and artworks to independent creatives
- Organisations damages NORPA/Lismore Regional Gallery/Byron School of Art etc can be estimated at around \$5m.

The delivery of this funding has given ANR unique insight and actual qualitative data recording the devastation and loss particular to the creative industries in the Northern Rivers. These key insights have informed the thinking and framework for this proposal.




