Your story I was not able to return home for 2 days as ewingsdale road was flooded , near shirley st outbound from byron bay , near kendall st turnoff (see pics attached)
this flooding will be made a lot worse when the west byron development is fully completed (see pic attached of proposed site flooded)
Belongil estuary is already taking in so much run

off from streets and parklands / wetlands / farmlands into ocean @ belongil beach north , that my local beach is not able to be used last 7 weeks , due pollution and brown foam on beach and in water

Our CBD in town also flooded in Byron Bay , made worse given the fact the stormwater outlet drain pipe has been blocked (buried under 2m of sand) near clarkes beach @ byron bay kayaks launch spot

We need any future developments to take into account the above info , our town can't cope with the storm water volumes experienced in el nina weather patterns with warmer weather / oceans and above average rainfalls
