At its peak there was roughly 1/2 meter of water

covering a max of 1 sq KM. That's 500,000 cubic meters of water beyond ability of drainage systems.

On the outskirts of Mullum, bordered by river, rugby club, and Argyle st is a large empty area. Where a dam/billabong, occupying 10 hectares to depth of 5 meters could be built to temporarily store excess water to be released at low tide. This would absorb the 500,000 meters of blood water.

This vast amount of soil could be used to raise land level on edges of dame or on opposite side of argyle st where social housing could be built. Dam can be emptied via pipeline under river with some kind of filtering.
