Property owners complained about drainage to council over years were ignored. There is photographic evidence of town drains. Further the m1 motorway is recognised as having two few outlets thus causing Hugh dam		
All documents and reports support that far too little in place		
Negotiating the DRG process extremely complicated and stressful. 4 months post event, still not resolved.


