	that the flood may enter our house.
	At around 3 in the morning the water was around
	10 cm deep running through our home.
	My husband moved our cattle and cars and work
	trailers so they wouldn't get flooded.
	I was moving what I could in the dark trying to

get the things we wanted to save upstairs.

At 5am in the morning I had a missed call from my elderly parents.

The water was running through their 12 year old home that was build one meter above the 1 in 100 year flood.

My dad who had 3 toes amputated last year could not walk through the fast running water.

My mother at 80 pulled herself through chest deep water grabbing onto branch's to pull herself through the water.

She ran to the neighbours to get help for dad. By the time the neighbours got to dad the water had risen too fast and they were trapped. They ran the ses multiple time and were eventually told they were not coming. My brother who also had water in his home waited until day light and went in a boat to save my father and neighbours.

He then went on rescuing another 10 people on their way home.
